© PROPOSAL VS. @ PROPOSAL LESSON PLAN

OBJECTIVE: The Steering Committee will evaluate and understand the elements of a fantastic project proposal.

SUPPORTING MATERIALS:

- Proposal Development Guide
- Proposal Discussion Worksheet
- Project Proposal Examples

TIMELINE: It is recommended to use this lesson plan before students begin Step 4 (Develop Project Proposals) of the Proposal Development Checklist.

APPROXIMATE LESSON LENGTH: 1 Steering Committee meeting

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Comparing Proposals

- **Set up** the Project Proposal Examples around the room
- **Divide steering committee** into small groups
- Have students pair up within their small groups and assign each pair a proposal to investigate
- Ask pairs to **find their proposals** around the room and **take notes** on their Proposal Discussion Worksheet:
 - o Grows: things that could be improved or changed in the proposal
 - o Glows: things that are amazing about the proposal

2. Small Group Discussion

- In small groups, ask students to answer the following discussion questions:
 - 1. Ask each pair to share their project proposal's "glows and grows" with the rest of the group.
 - 2. What were your "glows and grows" for your project proposal?
 - 3. What similarities do you see in the proposals?
 - 4. What makes one proposal better than another proposal?
 - 5. What can be added or changed to make proposals ready for the ballot?

3. Report Out

• Ask small groups to share out key takeaways from their discussion with the full group.
