

EMPATHY MAPPING LESSON PLAN

OBJECTIVE: The Steering Committee will better understand the experiences of students and teachers regarding specific project ideas and determine the "what, where, why, and how" for each top idea.

SUPPORTING MATERIALS:

- Proposal Development Guide
- Idea Category Empathy Map

TIMELINE: It is recommended to use this activity during step 3 (Research Top Ideas) of the Proposal Development Guide.

APPROXIMATE LESSON LENGTH: 1 - 2 Steering Committee meetings

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Introduction

- **Divide** the steering committee into their subcommittees.
- Ask each subcommittee to discuss the concept of empathy.
 - What is empathy?
 - If needed, SPB Sponsors can provide a common definition such as "the ability to understand and share the feelings of another" (Oxford Languages).
 - Can you provide an example of empathy vs. sympathy?
 - Why does empathy matter in the context of proposal development?
- Invite subcommittees to share answers with the rest of the steering committee.

2. Empathy Map

- **Explain** each subcommittee will **complete an Idea Category Empathy Map** for the top ideas in their idea category.
 - **Think & Feel:** What do students and/or teachers think about this idea? How do they feel?
 - **See:** What do students and/or teachers experience visually? Is there a specific location that students see or don't see this idea?
 - Hear: What do students and/or teachers hear about this idea?

- **Say & Do:** What do students and/or teachers say about this idea? What can this idea allow or not allow students and/or teachers to do?
- Now **complete the Grows & Glows** section of the Idea Category Empathy Map.
 - $\circ~$ Grows: What could be changed or improved?
 - Clows: What do we already have on campus that fulfills this idea and could be expanded to reach more students?

3. Empathy Interviews

- Subcommittees will collect more information about their top ideas by asking fellow students and teachers the same questions outlined above.
- Subcommittees might conduct these "empathy interviews" using the Idea Category Empathy Map during lunch, before or after school, during an advisory or homeroom period, etc.
